

**Motion for Enlargement of Time to File Proofs of Claim or in the Alternative, for Entry of Order Deeming Proofs of Claim Timely Filed (the “Johnson Motion”).**

By the Johnson Motion, Jean-Pierre Johnson and Karen Johnson (together, the “Johnsons”) seek entry of an order (i) enlarging their time to file proofs of claim or, alternatively, (ii) deeming their proofs of claim timely filed. Contemporaneously with the filing of the Johnson Motion, the Johnsons filed their proofs of claim (together, the “Proofs of Claim”) relating to a deposit of \$43,400 (the “Deposit”) in connection with the purchase of a home from TOUSA Homes, Inc. (“TOUSA Homes”).

On May 17, 2008, the Bankruptcy Court entered an order (the “Bar Date Order”) setting May 19, 2008 as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Debtors (the “Bar Date”). The Johnsons allege that they failed to file their Proofs of Claim timely because, among other things, they did not receive notice of the Bar Date, although the Johnson’s admit receipt of the proof of claim form.

The basis of the Proofs of Claim is the Johnson’s allegations that TOUSA Homes breached the sales contract entered into regarding the purchase of the Johnson’s home. Therefore, the purpose of the Johnson Motion is to preserve the Johnson’s ability to recover the Deposit. Accordingly, the Johnson’s request that the Bankruptcy Court enlarge the time for them to file the Proofs of Claim, or alternatively, deem the Proofs of Claim timely filed.
